



CONEFLOWER PLANTING TIPS

Native to North America, these hardy flowers are a favorite of bees, butterflies and birds.

Keep dormant roots dry till you're ready to plant, then soak for a few hours before planting in well-draining soil that receives plenty of direct sun.

Plant with the root's crown about 1/2"- 1" below soil level.

Echinacea is extremely drought-tolerant so avoid overwatering.

Once leaves have developed, water once a week during hot or dry weather but avoid watering if the soil is already wet.

Cut flowers are beautiful in arrangements or leave blooms on the plant and allow birds to feast on the dried seed heads.
