



DAHLIA PLANTING TIPS

Plant tubers with the stem facing up; cover with 2" of soil.

In early spring, start tubers indoors in a pot or plant directly outdoors in garden soil that has warmed to 60 degrees F.

Depending on your zone, dahlias can be planted outdoors any time after last frost and before late August.

Dahlias thrive in full sun with regular watering but keep the bottom foliage dry to deter pests.

For maximum blooms, apply an all-purpose 5-5-5 fertilizer at planting time and supplement with a liquid fertilizer once a month.
